Nursery - Our nursery is open every Sunday morning for babies and children up to three years of age.

Children's Sunday School – The current series for the children, from ages 4 to 10, is on Gratitude. Each week they take an amazing journey through the bible to find God's grace and all the abundant gifts He gave to His people. They also explore their own gratitude for all God has provided in their lives. It is informative, fun and full of God's grace and gratitude.

Adult Sunday School – Adult Sunday School is held from 10:45-11:45 a.m., following the Sunday service. Everyone is welcome to join our thought-provoking discussions.

Women's Study Group

Our Women's Bible Study Group meets on *the second and fourth Tuesday of each month* for discussion and fellowship. We meet at 6:15 p.m. in the Rowe Room of the Church, and ALL women are welcome – no reservations needed and you do not have to attend every gathering.

Our Men's Bible Study Group meets for conversation, dinner and fellowship at 6 p.m., on the first and third Tuesday of each month. Men of all ages enjoy the opportunity to gather informally for fellowship and discussion of a book on some aspect of Christian living. The current series is focused on Paul's Letter to the Philippians, and its meaning to us today, using the book "Paul for Everyone" by well-known Biblical scholar N. T. Wright.

Choir – Our choir practices most Wednesdays from 7 – 8 p.m. and warms-up on Sundays at 9 a.m. Our Music Director is Sam Brannon.

New Hanover Ringers – Pam O'Brien is the Director of our bell ringers.



"Food for Thought" Sundays! – We call the first Sunday of each month "Food for Thought" Sunday, because it is the designated service for collecting food items for local organizations that need food to help men, women, and children in need.



The third Sunday of each month is what we call "Mission Sunday". During this service, we hear about ways we can make a difference to others. One of those ways is by taking part in a **special collection we call 5 Cents-a-Meal**. By donating 5 cents for each meal they and their family eat in a month. That adds up to a small amount - \$4.50 per person - making a huge impact. This offering is a small first step in the battle against hunger and poverty.
