

If you are looking to follow Jesus in your daily life with the support and fellowship of a company of believers, you have found the right place. If you seek to commit to active involvement in worship, service and study, we invite you to join us in membership!

Please join us in the Laburnum Commons for hot cross buns and refreshments before the service.

Today's service commemorates the "triumphal entry" of Jesus into Jerusalem in the week before his crucifixion and resurrection. The Scriptures say that the people took branches from the nearby trees (including palms) and strewed the streets with some branches and used others to wave in the air. Each worshipper will receive a (sustainably harvested) palm branch to carry with them today as we process in our Palm Sunday "parade."

At the conclusion of the parade, we will enter the sanctuary by the west sanctuary door. *You are asked to go directly to the front and lay your palms on the chancel steps before you take your seat* (you are welcome to reclaim a palm later if you would like to take a branch home). To sit in the west side of the sanctuary, process back out of the sanctuary and go in by the west door again.

ALSO children will be given bells they can ring as we process. Please ask your child to refrain from ringing them during the program stops on the parade. When everyone goes forward to lay down their branch, the children will also lay down the bells as well for collection later.
